BROCCOLI BITES

2-3 cups steamed or frozen (thawed) broccoli, chopped finely
1 cup low fat grated cheese
3 eggs
1 cup flour (plain or wholemeal)
1 tsp dried oregano

Preheat oven to 190°C. Mix all ingredients in a large bowl. Roll mixture into bite-size balls and place on a lined tray. Bake for 25 mins or until golden.

STUFFED POTATO

Prick holes in a potato or kumara with a fork. Wrap in tin foil and bake for 45-60mins at 180°C OR cook in microwave 3-5mins each side.

Once cooked, scoop out middle of potato. Mash with your choice of GROW or GLOW fillings: baked beans, cheese, onion, mushroom, corn, ham or pineapple.

Refill potato and bake for 10-15mins.

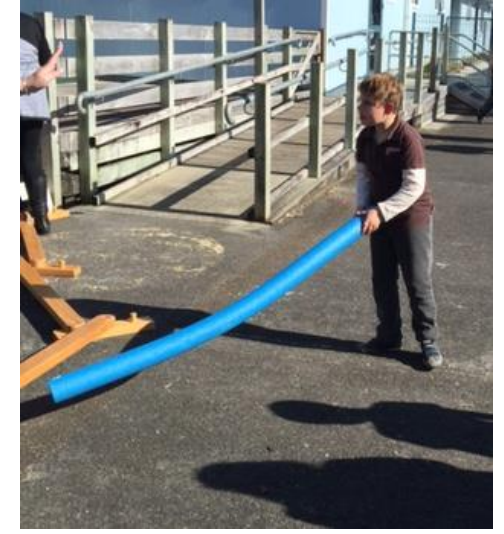
