



ENERGIZE PROGRAMME 2016

Energize is a programme that has been part of the Hamilton North Curriculum for the past eight years. Supported by Sport Waikato the programme targets all students to increase their abilities in movement and exercise. A skill based programme that targets the 12 Fundamental Skills identified as essential to enhance the quality of life in all children.

They are: Run, Gallop, Hop, Leap, Jump, Skip, Slide, Two Handed Strike, Stationary, Bounce, Catch, Kick and Overhand Throw.

Each individual student is tested in March and again in November so the programme can identify areas that need development and these areas are incorporated into daily sessions.
